	Section 1. Section 53A-1-710 is enacted to read:
	53A-1-710. Grants for digital textbooks.
	(1) As used in this section:

	(b) "Local education agency" or "LEA" means a school district, a school within a

	(c) In awarding a grant under Subsection (2), the State Board of Education shall

61	exceeds \$500 per student for the purchase of digital content and hardware.

82	Section 3. Appropriation.
83	Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, for
84	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016, the following sums of money
85	are appropriated from resources not otherwise appropriated, or reduced from amounts
86	previously appropriated, out of the funds or accounts indicated. These sums of money are in
87	addition to any amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2016.

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90	Schedule of Programs:

92	The Legislature intends that:
93	(1) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation under this section is to be used to purchase the
94	digital content and hardware described in Subsections 53A-1-710(2)(b)(ii)(A) and (B);
95	(2) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation under this section is to be used for the professional
96	development described in Subsection 53A-1-710(2)(b)(ii)(C) or to purchase peripherals or
97	networking equipment described in Subsection 53A-1-710(2)(b)(ii)(D); and
98	(3) the appropriation under this section is:
99	(a) ongoing, subject to availability of funds; and
100	(b) non-lapsing.
101	Section 4. Effective date.
102	(1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), this bill takes effect on May 12, 2015.
