



I-15 Virgin River Bridge Rehabilitation Projects 2014-15

PROJECT OVERVIEW

In an ongoing effort to improve the Interstate 15 Virgin River Gorge roadway corridor, the Arizona Department of Transportation will begin a series of bridge rehabilitation projects in January 2014.

I-15 is located in Mohave County in the most northwestern corner of Arizona and is vital in providing a direct transportation and commerce link between Arizona, Nevada, and Utah. The bridge improvement projects are all part of a larger study to identify and improve the 29-mile interstate.

Initial construction will take place at the following **southbound** bridge locations:

- ▶ Virgin River Bridge #2 (milepost 13.19), Bridge #3 (milepost 13.27), and Bridge #7 (milepost 22.55) are part of a \$2.8 million project involving bridge deck rehabilitation, girder repair and other work. The anticipated completion is summer 2014.
- ▶ Virgin River Bridge #6 (milepost 15.58) is a \$27 million project involving reconstructing the existing bridge to provide a four-lane undivided highway with wider shoulders. The anticipated completion is 2015.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ▶ The highway will be narrowed to one lane in each direction at each bridge for the duration of the bridge work
- ▶ Workers will be present from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays, although work schedule may vary
- ▶ Wide-load restrictions will be in place around the clock
- ▶ Travel delays are anticipated during these projects, plan accordingly
