Students will be divided into five groups by age based on Montessori principles: 5 -6 year olds (2 groups) (incoming and leaving Kindergarten students) 6-9 year olds (grades 1-3 this past school year) 9-11 year olds (grades 4-5 the past school year) 12- 14 year olds (grades 6-8 the past school year) These groups correspond with the groups in our school.

Class descriptions:

Math / Science class - Students will be able to use ALECKS, an on-line, individualized Math curriculum, with goals set and monitored by the teacher/mentors in the room. They will also participate in weekly science explorations using materials and curriculum from the Utah Museum of Natural History. Technology, computer skills and keyboarding, and design and engineering skills will also be a part of this program.

Reading/Civics. - We will use Read Naturally- a fluency based intervention, with all students as the basis for our reading instruction. We will also use SRA reading programs with leveled readers to individualize reading opportunities. Some students will receive STAR tutoring support from trained volunteers. We will also participate in weekly Civics based activities focused on community service, Utah and local history, current events and the Constitution.

Writing and Research- All students will have opportunities to compose poetry, do extended research and write papers, do oral presentations, and focus on grammar and basic skills. Utah Compose will be a foundational piece of this curriculum.

Activities. Students will be able to make daily choices to participate in music /drama, art activities, or sports (soccer, baseball, kickball etc.) Students can participate in a walking or running club challenge as part of our opening and end of day activities.

Every other Friday will include a school-wide enrichment program including the following; Field trips- Hikes

Water days

Competitions

Special speakers

Community service projects

We will involve parent as guest speakers, chaperones for Friday activities, opening and closing activities and we will sponsor two parent training nights during the summer.

- 1. At home tutoring and reading support (Based on STAR tutoring concepts)
- 2. Principles of a Montessori based education Differentiation, enriched environments, and self determination.

We will also plan a family night at the pool and a family movie night at school.
