**A RESOLUTION OF THE CEDAR CITY COUNCIL PRESERVING THE CITY'S
LEIGH HILL WATER TANK AS A ~~MONUMENT~~ **MARKER** TO THE
REDMEN OF CEDAR CITY **AND THE NORTH WATER TANK AS A MARKER TO
THE CANYON VIEW HIGH SCHOOL****

WHEREAS, since the early 1940's Cedar High School has used the Redmen name as a symbol of pride to represent its school, community and Cedar City's Native American heritage; and

WHEREAS, as a means of inspiring community and school pride, Cedar City has allowed representatives from Cedar High School to paint its Leigh Hill water tank with the colors and symbol of the Cedar High Redmen; and

WHEREAS, the City's Leigh Hill water tank has borne the colors and Redmen symbol of Cedar High School since the early 1970's; and

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2019, the School Board of the Iron County School District voted to retire the Redmen symbol of Cedar High School; and

WHEREAS, as a way to preserve and highlight the City's historic school, community and Native American heritage, and in an effort to educate the public about city history, the City desires to preserve the Leigh Hill water tank as a ~~monument~~ **marker** to the City and all people of the City and State of Utah, to bear the colors and Redmen symbol of Cedar High School; and

WHEREAS, the dates of 1942-2019 will be added to denote the years that this ~~monument~~ **marker** honors; and

WHEREAS, as a means of inspiring community and school pride, Cedar City has allowed representatives from Canyon View High School to paint its North water tank with the colors and symbol of Canyon View High School; and

WHEREAS, the City's North water tank has borne the colors and symbol of Canyon View High School since the early 2000's; and

WHEREAS, as a way to preserve and highlight the City's community and school pride, the City desires to preserve the North water tank as a marker for Canyon View High School, for all people of the City and State of Utah; said water tank to bear the colors and symbol of Canyon View High School respectively; and

WHEREAS, the funds needed to maintain the aesthetic elements of the Leigh Hill water tank **and the North water tank** will be obtained from donations and not tax payer money; and

WHEREAS, the City held a public meeting which was duly published and held before the Cedar City Council on the 5th day of June, 2019, and on the 17th of July, 2019, and after receiving all public input, if any, and duly debating and considering the proposed resolution, the Cedar City Council finds that it is in the best interests of the health, safety, welfare, and economy of Cedar City to preserve the Leigh Hill water tank as a ~~monument~~ marker reserved to bear the colors and Redmen symbol of Cedar High School and to preserve the North water tank as a marker reserved to bear the colors and symbol of Canyon View High School.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Cedar City, Iron County, State of Utah, that for the reasons specified therein:

As pertaining to the Leigh Hill water tank:

1. the City's Leigh Hill water tank located on top of Leigh Hill shall from this day forth be designated as a ~~monument~~ marker to the City and all people of the City and State of Utah, to bear the colors and Redmen symbol of Cedar High School, and the dates of 1942-2019; and
2. the funds needed to maintain the aesthetic elements of the Leigh Hill water tank will be obtained from donations and not tax payer money; and
3. the Leigh Hill water tank will be examined annually by representatives of the city; and
4. the special interest group, led by Paul Cozzens, will be responsible for the aesthetic maintenance and upkeep to the Leigh Hill water tank and if determined, any repairs necessary will be completed in a timely manner; and
5. the Leigh Hill water tank will be completely repainted and updated every 10 years by the special interest group; and
6. any plans to change the aesthetic representations contained on the Leigh Hill water tank will need City Council approval prior to being painted; and
7. the City retains ownership and complete control over the Leigh Hill water tank, if at any time the special interest group fails to perform the needed aesthetic maintenance and repairs to the exterior of the water tank the City may act in accordance with what is in the best interest of the City; and
8. the binding effect of this resolution shall expire when the City Council votes to allow the Leigh Hill water tank to be used for a different purpose.

As pertaining to the North water tank:

1. the City's North water tank located near the City's Golf Course shall from this day forth be designated as a marker to the City and all people of the City and State of Utah, to bear the colors and symbol of Canyon View High School; and
2. the funds needed to maintain the aesthetic elements of the North water tank will be obtained from donations and not tax payer money; and
3. the North water tank will be examined annually by representatives of the city; and
4. Canyon View High School or their assigned representatives will be responsible for the aesthetic maintenance and upkeep of the North water tank, said aesthetic repairs will need to be completed in a timely manner; and
5. any plans to change the aesthetic representations contained on the North water tank will need City Council approval prior to being painted; and

6. the City retains ownership and complete control over the North water tank, if at any time Canyon View High School fails to perform the needed aesthetic maintenance and repairs to the exterior of the water tank the City may act in accordance with what is in the best interest of the City; and
7. the binding effect of this resolution shall expire when the City Council votes to allow the North water tanks to be used for a different purpose.
